VOCABULARY

1. **Posit:** to suggest something as a basic fact or principle from which a further idea is formed or developed.
 - **Synonyms:** propound, proffer
 - **Antonyms:** withhold, withdraw
 - **Example:** I would like to posit that a good night's sleep positively affects productivity.
2. **Lag:** a delay between two things happening.
 - **Synonyms:** interruption, latency
 - **Antonyms:** expedition, haste
 - **Example:** The lag in delivery caused some customers to express dissatisfaction.
3. **Evident:** easily seen or understood.
 - **Synonyms:** obvious, palpable
 - **Antonyms:** ambiguous, abstruse
 - **Example:** The impact of climate change is becoming increasingly evident in extreme weather events.

4. **Underscore:** to emphasise or show that something is important or true.

- **Synonyms:** stress, accentuate
- **Antonyms:** trivialise, downplay
- **Example:** His confidence demeanor underscored his leadership qualities.

5. **Vagaries:** unexpected events or changes that cannot be controlled and can influence a situation.

- **Synonyms:** aberrations, irregularities
- **Antonyms:** stability, normality
- **Example:** Jenny embraced the vagaries of life with a carefree attitude.

6. **Vigour:** strength, energy, or enthusiasm

- **Synonyms:** zeal, ardour
- **Antonyms:** lethargy, torpor
- **Example:** The lively discussion in the meeting added vigour to the team's collaborative spirit.

7. **Unenviable:** difficult or unpleasant; that you would not want to have.

- **Synonyms:** uninviting, unappealing
- **Antonyms:** desirable, coveted
- **Example:** Facing the unenviable task of cleaning the messy room, she sighed.

8. **Intent:** to be determined to do or achieve something.

- **Synonyms:** resolved, steadfast
- **Antonyms:** faltering, hesitant
- **Example:** Despite the challenges, he remained intent on achieving his goals.

9. **Propping up:** helping something that is having difficulties.

10. **On steroids:** much larger, stronger, or more extreme than is normal or expected.

11. **Make bold:** to act or speak in a daring and confident way.

12. **At a low ebb:** in a poor state; worse than usual.
