## **<u>CURRENT AFFAIRS</u>** 12<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY, 2024

- Türkiye, India and Qatar have been declared the guests of honor at the 2024 World Governments Summit set to take place in Dubai from February 12-14.
  - The summit, held under the theme of "Shaping Future Governments," will also host more than 25 government and state heads.
- 2. The Supreme Court of India recently agreed to examine whether the words "socialist" and "secular" can be removed from the Preamble of the Indian Constitution.
- **3.** President Droupadi Murmu will inaugurate the Aadi Mahotsav 2024, an annual National Tribal Festival at Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium in New Delhi.
  - Minister for Tribal Affairs Arjun Munda will also be present on the occasion. The event, organised by TRIFED under the aegis of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, will showcase the rich diversity of India's tribal heritage till the 18th of this month.

- **4.** Rajasthan Government, Finance Minister Diya Kumari has announced the launch of 'Lado Protsahan Yojana' in the state. Under this scheme, it has been announced to give savings bonds of Rs1 lakh to those girls whose families are poor.
- **5.** Sikkim CM Prem Singh Tamang reinstates Old Pension Scheme for state govt. employees appointed on or after April 1, 2006.
- 6. After a gap of nearly 40 years, Olive Ridley turtles (Lepidochelys olivacea) returned to nest on the beaches of Karnataka's Mangaluru division in February 2024, overcoming environmental challenges such as increased salinity and pollution.
- **7.** ADB approves \$200M loan for Assam to tackle Brahmaputra River flood and erosion risks. Project aims to empower communities, stabilize riverbanks, and enhance disaster resilience.
- 8. National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS) has been awarded the 2024 Nelson-Mandela Award (NMA) by the World Health Organization (WHO) for Health Promotion.

- **9.** India's Olympic and world champion javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra has been honoured with a plaque at the famous Ice Palace at Jungfraujoch, known as the 'Top of Europe', in Switzerland.
