1.The 54th annual meeting of the World Economic Forum has commenced in Davos, Switzerland on 15 January 2024.

The theme of the conference is "Rebuilding Trust," focusing on exploring opportunities presented by new technologies and their impact on decisionmaking and global partnerships.

2. Prime Minister Narendra Modi proclaimed January 16 as National Startup Day 2024, marking a pivotal moment in India's recognition and celebration of its burgeoning startup ecosystem.
