VOCABULARY

1. **Scrutinised:** looked at or examined somebody/something carefully.
 - **Synonyms:** investigated, analysed
 - **Antonyms:** neglected, disregarded
 - **Example:** The auditor will scrutinise the financial records to identify any discrepancies.
2. **Implications:** Effects that an action or decision will have on something else in the future.
 - **Synonyms:** repercussion, fallout
 - **Antonyms:** cause, basis
 - **Example:** The sudden drop in temperature had serious health implications
3. **Abstaining:** deciding not to do or have something.
 - **Synonyms:** eschewing, refraining
 - **Antonyms:** embracing, indulging
 - **Example:** Despite the tempting offer, I choose to abstain from participating in the risky adventure.
4. **Tactful:** careful not to say or do anything that will annoy or upset other people.
 - **Synonyms:** diplomatic, politic
 - **Antonyms:** insensitive, thoughtless

- **Example:** Sarah was always tactful in offering constructive criticism during team meeting.
5. **Stringent:** very strict and that must be obeyed.
- **Synonyms:** rigorous, exacting
 - **Antonyms:** lenient, lax
 - **Example:** The airline has stringent or duty to do something.
6. **Onus:** the responsibility or duty to do something
- **Synonyms:** obligation, imperative
 - **Antonyms:** exemption, freedom
 - **Example:** The onus is on the student to complete their assignment on time.
7. **Culpability:** The fact of being responsible and deserving blame for having done something wrong.
- **Synonyms:** blameworthiness, accountability
 - **Antonyms:** innocence, faultlessness
 - **Example:** Despite the evidence, the suspect denied any culpability in the theft.
8. **Scrapped:** cancelled or got rid of something that was no longer practical or useful.
- **Synonyms:** abolished, abandoned
 - **Antonyms:** retained, preserved
 - **Example:** She scrapped her initial plan and decided to try a new approach.
9. **Precarious:** not safe or certain; dangerous.
- **Synonyms:** perilous, parlous
 - **Antonyms:** secure, reliable

- **Example:** Driving on the slippery road made the journey feel precarious.

10. **Checks and balances:** rules intended to prevent on person or group from having too much power within an organisation.

11. **Brings into play:** cause something to start working so that one can make use of it.

12. **Resort to:** to do something that you do not want to do because you cannot find any other way of achieving something
13. **Strike down:** to declare a law illegal and unenforceable.
14. **Press ahead:** to start or continue doing something in a determined way, although it is difficult.
