- 1. Malfeasance: illegal actions, especially those of a government official or large business company.
 - Synonyms: wrongdoing, misconduct
 - Antonyms: Obedience, fairness
 - Example: The company's CEO was investigating for financial malfeasance.
- 2. Chariness: the trait of being cautious and watchful.
 - Synonyms: wariness, vigilance
 - Antonyms: heedlessness, negligence
 - Example: His chariness in sharing personal information made him a private individual.
- 3. Emphatic: strong and clear, without any possibility for doubt.
 - Synonyms: definite, unequivocal
 - Antonyms: ambiguous, vague
 - Example: She gave an emphatic nod to express her agreement.
- 4. Warrant: to make something necessary or appropriate in a particular situation
 - Synonyms: necessitate, require
 - Antonyms: exclude, omit

- Example: Severe weather conditions may warrant a school closure.
- 5. Skirted: avoided talking about a subject, especially because it is difficult or embarrassing.
 - Synonyms: evaded, dodged
 - Antonyms: confronted, tackled
 - Example: She skirted around the difficult question during the interview.
- 6. Capricious: likely to change or reacting to a sudden desire or new idea.
 - Synonyms: variable, erratic
 - Antonyms: steady, stable
 - Example: Planning a picnic was difficult with the capricious nature of the wind.
- 7. Assuage: to make an unpleasant feeling less severe.
 - Synonyms: alleviate, allay
 - Antonyms: aggravate, heighten
 - Example: To assuage her worries, he reassured her that everything would be okey.
- 8. Tardiness: the quality of being late or slow.
 - Synonyms: unpunctuality, sluggishness
 - Antonyms: promptitude, timeliness
 - Example: Sarah apologized for her tardiness to the meeting, explaining that traffic was unexpectedly heavy.
