

1. Inculcate: to fix beliefs or ideas in someone's mind especially by repeating them often.

- Synonyms: instil, ingrain
- Antonyms: erase, banish
- Example: Parents often try to inculcate a sense of responsibility in their children.
- 2. Prominent: easily seen.
 - Synonyms: striking, pronounced
 - Antonyms: inconspicuous, obscured
 - Example: The prominent mountain stood tall against the clear blue sky.
- 3. Vices: moral faults or weaknesses in a person's character.
 - Synonyms: depravity, profligacy
 - Antonyms: virtue, righteousness
 - Example: Despite warnings, he couldn't resist the allure of the gambling vice.

4. Rampant: (of something bad) existing or spreading everywhere in a way that cannot be controlled.

- Synonyms: rife, pervasive
- Antonyms: rare, infrequent
- Example: Misinformation spread rampant on social media, causing confusion among the users.
- 5. Quell: to stop something, especially by using force.
 - Synonyms: quash, subdue
 - Antonyms: encourage, foster
 - Example: The security guard stepped in to quell the escalating argument between two customers.
- 6. Vitiated: destroyed or damaged something.
 - Synonyms: impaired, compromised
 - Antonyms: enhanced, strengthened
 - Example: It's essential not to let negative thoughts vitiate your motivation to pursue your goals.
- 7. Bemusing: making somebody confused and unable to think clearly.
 - Synonyms: perplexing, baffling
 - Antonyms: fathomable, comprehensible
 - Example: The professor's bemusing explanation left the students scratching their heads.

8. Conductive: providing the right conditions for something to happen or exist.

- Synonyms: opportune, propitious
- Antonyms: adverse, detrimental
- Example: Adequate sleep is conductive to overall well-being.
- 9. Deter: to prevent someone from doing something or to make someone less enthusiastic about doing something.
 - Synonyms: dissuade, inhibit
 - Antonyms: persuade, embolden
 - Example: The warning label is designed to deter misuse of the product.
- 10. Shun: to avoid someone or something.
 - Synonyms: ditch, rebuff
 - Antonyms: embrace, cherish
 - Example: Sarah decided to shun social media for a while to focus on her studies.
- **11.** Imminent: coming or likely to happen very soon.
 - Synonyms: impending, looming
 - Antonyms: remote, distant
 - Example: The storm clouds gathered, signaling the imminent rain.
