 - Synonyms: dissatisfaction, disgruntlement
 - Antonyms: gratification, fulfilment
 - Example: The employee expressed discontent with the new work policies.
- 9. Espousing: adopting or supporting a cause, belief, or way of life.
 - Synonyms: championing, advocating
 - Antonyms: opposing, rejecting
 - Example: The professor often espouses the importance of critical thinking in his lectures.
