VOCABULARY

1. **Partisanship:** The fact of showing too much support for one person, group or idea especially without considering it carefully.

- **Synonyms:** bias, partiality
- **Antonyms:** equity, fairness
- **Example:** The decision-making process was hindered by excessive partisanship among team members.

2. **Exhibit:** to show something publicly.

- **Synonyms:** display, showcase
- **Antonyms:** conceal, veil
- **Example:** Sarah will exhibit her artwork at the local gallery next week.

3. **Pomp:** impressive and colourful ceremonies, especially traditional ceremonies on public occasions.

- **Synonyms:** grandeur, magnificence
- **Antonyms:** simplicity, modesty
- **Example:** the royal procession moved with great pomp through the city.

4. **Momentous**: very important because of effects on future events.

- **Synonyms**: pivotal, consequential
- **Antonyms**: trivial, minor
- **Example**: Opening the acceptance letter felt like a momentous moment in her life.

5. **Anguish**: extreme unhappiness caused physical or mental suffering.

- **Synonyms**: distress, agony
- **Antonyms**: delight, contentment
- **Example**: Witnessing the accident filled him with a sense of helpless anguish.

6. **Potency**: the power of something to influence or make an impression.

- **Synonyms**: efficacy, strength
- **Antonyms**: incapacity, enervation
- **Example**: The potency of the medicine quickly relieved her headache.

7. **Heydays**: the most successful or popular period of someone or something.

- **Synonyms**: golden days, halcyon days

- **Antonyms:** rock bottom, dark age
- **Example:** the company experienced its heyday in the 1990s when its products gained widespread popularity.

8. Discontent: a feeling of being unhappy because you are not satisfied with a particular situation.

- **Synonyms:** dissatisfaction, disgruntlement
- **Antonyms:** gratification, fulfilment
- **Example:** The employee expressed discontent with the new work policies.

9. Espousing: adopting or supporting a cause, belief, or way of life.

- **Synonyms:** championing, advocating
- **Antonyms:** opposing, rejecting
- **Example:** The professor often espouses the importance of critical thinking in his lectures.

PHRASAL VERBS

1. Relying on: needing a particular thing or the help and support of someone or something in order to continue, to work correctly, or to succeed.

2. **Handed over:** gave another person control of someone or something, or responsibility for dealing with him, her, or it.

IDIOMS

1. **Crying foul:** saying that something that ha happened is unfair or illegal.
2. **Make the cut:** to meet the requirements necessary for an application to be successful or to be selected from a group of candidates.
3. **Staying put:** remaining in the same place or position.
