- Succour (Noun/Verb): Assistance, support, or relief given in times of difficulty or distress. To give aid, help, or comfort.
 - Synonyms: Aid, Assistance, Support, Relief.
 - Antonyms: Neglect, Abandonment, Hindrance.
 - sentence: The community rallied to provide succour to the victims of the natural disaster.
- **2.** Expedited (Adjective): Originally planned for a faster pace or immediate action.
 - Synonyms: Accelerated, Hastened, Quickened, Fast-tracked.
 - Antonyms: Delayed, Protracted, Slowed.
 - sentence: The company expedited the delivery of the urgent order to meet the client's tight deadline.
- 3. Erstwhile (Adjective): Formerly or in the past.
 - Synonyms: Former, Previous, Old, Past.
 - Antonyms: Current, Present, Ongoing.
 - sentence: The erstwhile manager retired after decades of dedicated service to the company.
- **4.** Subversion (Noun): The act or process of undermining or sabotaging, especially in a secretive or insidious manner.

- Synonyms: Sabotage, Undermining, Treachery, Espionage.
- Antonyms: Loyalty, Allegiance, Support.
- sentence: The spy's activities were a clear case of subversion aimed at destabilizing the government.
- **5.** Plethora (Noun): An excessive amount or abundance of something.
 - Synonyms: Excess, Surplus, Overflow, Abundance.
 - Antonyms: Scarcity, Shortage, Insufficiency.
 - sentence: The bookstore had a plethora of books catering to various interests and genres.
- 6. Indictment (Noun): A formal charge or accusation of a serious crime, typically presented by a grand jury.
 - Synonyms: Accusation, Charge, Allegation, Prosecution.
 - Antonyms: Acquittal, Exoneration, Vindication.
 - sentence: The grand jury issued an indictment against the suspect for embezzlement.
- 7. Poised (Adjective): Having a composed and self-assured manner, often ready for action or decision.
 - Synonyms: Confident, Ready, Prepared, Balanced.
 - Antonyms: Unsteady, Nervous, Hesitant.
 - sentence: The speaker was poised and articulate, delivering the presentation with grace and confidence.

- 8. Morass (Noun): A complex and confusing situation; a tangled or confusing mass.
 - Synonyms: Quagmire, Tangle, Confusion, Predicament.
 - Antonyms: Clear, Ordered, Simple, monotone.
 - sentence: The legal morass surrounding the case made it challenging to discern a clear path forward.
- 9. Credible (Adjective): Capable of being believed or trusted; reliable.
 - Synonyms: Trustworthy, Reliable, Dependable, Authentic.
 - Antonyms: Unreliable, Dubious, Untrustworthy.
 - sentence: The witness provided credible evidence that strengthened the case against the accused.
- 10. Brazen (Adjective): Bold and without shame; displaying a lack of respect for conventional behavior.
 - Synonyms: Shameless, Bold, Audacious, Impudent.
 - Antonyms: Subtle, Modest, Reserved.
 - sentence: The politician's brazen remarks stirred controversy and public criticism.
- 11. Totter (Verb): To move unsteadily, often on the verge of falling; to sway or waver.
 - Synonyms: Stagger, Falter, Teeter, Reel.
 - Antonyms: Stabilize, Stand firm, Remain steady.
 - sentence: The old building seemed to totter in the strong winds, raising concerns about its structural integrity.

- 12. Retract (Verb): To withdraw or take back something, especially a statement or accusation.
 - Synonyms: Withdraw, Recant, Revoke, Abjure.
 - Antonyms: Affirm, Assert, Confirm.
 - sentence: Realizing the mistake, the spokesperson decided to retract the misleading statement.
- 13. Respite (Noun): A short period of rest, relief, or temporary delay from something challenging or difficult.
 - Synonyms: Break, Intermission, Reprieve, Pause.
 - Antonyms: Continuation, Perseverance, Endurance.
 - sentence: After weeks of intense work, the holiday provided a much-needed respite for the exhausted team.
- 14. Loom (Verb): To appear or stand over someone in a threatening or imminent way; to be about to happen.
 - Synonyms: Impend, Approach, Threaten, Menace.
 - Antonyms: Recede, Retreat, Dissipate.
 - sentence: The dark clouds on the horizon signaled that a storm was looming


