CURRENT AFFAIRS 11th October, 2024

- 1. Indian Naval Ship (INS) Talwararrived in Simon's Town, South Africa to join India-Brazil-South Africa Maritime (IBSAMAR VIII). Running until October 18, it emphasizes Blue Water Naval Warfare, aiming to enhance interoperability.
 - The exercise includes drills, professional exchanges, and joint operations, reinforcing India-South Africa defence ties and fostering mutual growth.

- 2. The Nobel prize in literature has been awarded to 53-year-old South Korean novelist Han Kang for her "intense poetic prose that confronts historical traumas and exposes the fragility of human life".

- 3. The Red Panda Program of Darjeeling's Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park has been selected as a finalist for the World Association of Zoos and Aquariums (WAZA) Conservation Award 2024.
 - Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park has undertaken several habitat restoration initiatives in collaboration with various institutions and the government of India. Between 2022 and 2024, nine captive-bred red pandas (seven females and two males) were released into Singalila National Park in West Bengal.
 - The zoo's conservation efforts are strengthened by its Biobanking and Genetic Resource Facility, wherein gametes, tissues, and DNA of Red Pandas and other endangered species will be preserved for future use.
 - The winner for the WAZA award will be announced on the 7th of next month at the 79th WAZA Annual Conference in Australia's Tarongo Zoo.
- 4. India's National Space Commission has approved the Lunar Polar Exploration Mission (Lupex), a collaboration with Japan's JAXA. Set to last 100 days, Lupexaims to explore water resources on the Moon, enhancing future lunar missions and strengthening international cooperation in space exploration.

- 5. The central government has given temporary approval to create Bihar's second tiger reserve in Kaimur district. This decision came after a proposal from the Bihar state government and is aimed at improving wildlife protection in the area.
- 6. On October 6, 2024, the upper stage of the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle C-37 (PSLV-C37) successfully re-entered the Earth's atmosphere.
 - This mission, which launched on February 15, 2017, was a major achievement for the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), as it set a world record by launching 104 satellites in a single mission.
- 7. The Union Cabinet, in a meeting held on 9 October 2024 and chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the development of the National Maritime Heritage Complex at Lothal, Gujarat. The Heritage Complex to be developed at the ancient Indus Valley Civilisation site of Lothal will be developed in two phases.
 - The National Maritime Heritage Complex is being developed as an international tourist destination. It would display India's maritime heritage from ancient to modern times and raise public awareness about it.

- 8. Rafael Nadal on Thursday announced his retirement from professional tennis after the Davis Cup finals in November, ending a 23-year career that saw him win 22 Grand Slam titles and two Olympic golds.
 - The 38-year-old is second in the men's all-time list for number of wins, after Serbian Novak Djokovic.
- 9. In badminton, the 2024 Arctic Open kicks off today in Finland. Indian players PV Sindhu and Lakshya Sen will make their return to the court for the first time since the Paris Olympics. Other Indian participants in the tournament include Kidambi Srikanth, Aakarshi Kashyap, Kiran George, and Malvika Bansod.
 - There will be no Indians in the men's doubles, as Chirag Shetty and Satwiksairaj Rankireddy have withdrawn from the event. The match between Malvika Bansod and Taiwanese player Sung Shuo Yun is in progress. The tournament will conclude on the 13th of this month.
- 10. In a statement, the IOA said, "The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) is pleased to announce that the 38th edition of the National Games will be held in Uttarakhand from 28 January to 14 February 2025 (subject to the approval of IOA's General Assembly, which is scheduled to meet in New Delhi on 25 October 2024).
